

In addition to Gandi's <u>General Terms and Conditions</u> for domain name registration, the registration and use of a .CA domain name implies the acceptance of and compliance to the present special conditions contained herein.

All Your legal information and contracts can be viewed at any time via Our <u>website</u>. Capitalized terms have the definition attributed to them in Our <u>General Terms and Conditions</u> of Domain Name Registration. Specifically, "You" refers to the owner of the domain name, and "We" designates Gandi. Your current contracts are freely available for viewing when You log into Your account at: http://www.gandi.net/admin/contracts/.

Section .CA.1. Trustee authority and Registry

.CA is the official country code Top-Level-Domain (ccTLD) of Canada. The following diagram presents the various parties involved and the Trustee Authority for the .CA TLD:



You can view the information and special rules of each party involved by clicking on the respective links.

Section .CA.2. Registration terms and conditions

When You apply to register a .CA domain name, You acknowledge that You have fully understood, and that You certify to have full knowledge of and that You agree to abide by all the rules and specific conditions of .CA domain names, as defined by CIRA, and which may be viewed at the following pages:

These contracts are binding between You and the .CA Registry.

The special conditions contained herein do not replace these Rules, but rather form part of them. You acknowledge to have fully understood and to have accepted these Rules on Our Website.

You do not acquire property rights of the domain name registered but rather that You are granted user rights of the domain name,

Section .CA.3. Special requirements

.CA special requirements are available at: http://www.gandi.net/domain/ca/info

Eligibility

.CA domain names are open to persons connected to Canada according with the <u>Canadian Presence Requirements for Registrants</u>.

The following categories of persons are eligible to the registration of a .CA domain name:

- Canadian citizen major under the laws of the province or territory in Canada in which he resides or last resided,
- Permanent resident of Canada major under the laws of the province or territory in Canada in which he resides or last resided and who is ordinarily resident in Canada. "Ordinarily resident in Canada" means any individual who resides in Canada for more than 183 days in the 12 months period preceding the registration date of the .CA domain name and in each 12 month period thereafter for the duration of the domain name registration.
- Legal representative of a Canadian citizen or permanent resident.
- Corporation under the laws of Canada or any province or territory of Canada (corporation, charity and cooperative registered)
- **Trust** established and subsisting under the laws of any province or territory of Canada, and which meets the conditions required by the <u>Canadian Presence Requirements for Registrants (e)</u>,
- Partnership registered under the laws of any province or territory of Canada, and which meets the conditions required by the Canadian Presence Requirements for Registrants (f),
- Unincorporated organization which is based and operating in Canada, and which meets the conditions required by the Canadian Presence Requirements for Registrants (g),
- Trade union recognized by a labour board under the laws of Canada or any province or territory of Canada and which has its head office in Canada,
- Political party registered under a relevant electoral law of Canada or any province or territory of Canada.
- Educational institution located in Canada and authorized or recognize by the relevant authorities or by the laws of Canada or any province or territory of Canada, and which meets the conditions required by the <u>Canadian Presence Requirements for</u> Registrants (i).
- Library, Archive or Museum located in Canada and which is

not established or conduct for profit, and which meets the conditions required by the <u>Canadian Presence Requirements for</u> Registrants (k),

- Hospital located in Canada and which is licensed, authorized or approved to operate as an hospital under the laws of any province or territory of Canada,
- · Her Majesty the Queen and her successors,
- Indian band as defined in the Canadian Indian Act (R.S.C. 1985, c.1-5) as amended from time to time, and any group of Indian bands.
- Aboriginal people to Canada, and any individual belonging to an aboriginal people to Canada and any collectivity of such aboriginal to Canada,
- Government: Her Majesty the Queen in right of Canada, a
 province or a territory of Canada, an agent of Her Majesty the
 Queen in right of Canada, of a province or a territory of Canada, a
 federal, provincial or territory Crown corporation, government
 agency or entity, a regional, municipal or local aera government,
- Owner of a trademark registered in Canada under the Canadian Trade-marks Act (R.S.C 1985, c.T-13) as amended from time to time (if You do not meet any other condition under the <u>Canadian Presence Requirements for Registrants</u>), the domain name must consist of or include the exact word component of the trademark,
- Beneficiary of an official mark protected by the Canadian Trade-Mark Act (Subsection 9(1)) (if You do not meet any other condition under the <u>Canadian Presence Requirements for</u> <u>Registrants</u>), the domain name must consist of or include the exact word component of such official mark.

Information to provide during the registration process

During the registration of Your .CA domain name in Our website, please indicate:

- · Your eligibility type as defined above,
- additional information required depending on Your type:
 - Corporation: Your legal form,
 - **Legal representative**: Your name and capacity. In addition the legal representative must be indicated as the administrative contact of the domain name.

In any case, You must indicate Your exact and full official name of the owner contact.

The Registry may request documentary evidences of Your eligibility to register Your domain name and during the registration period of Your domain name.

Procedure for a first registration at Gandi

The registration of Your domain name is subject to the acceptance of the Registry Registrant Agreement as provided by Gandi during Your registration. The presentation of this Agreement and its acceptance by the registrant are pre-conditions to the granting of the domain name. The Registry, at its sole discretion, shall have the ability to delete a domain name if the Registry determines that the Registrant Agreement was not expressly presented to the registrant, or that he has not agree to the current version of the Registrant Agreement.

The acceptance of the Registrant Agreement applies to Your registration request in process and to Your subsequent requests through Gandi. You will be bound by the version in force at the time of Your requests.

Specific rules within the framework of IDN

.CA domain names can be registered as IDN (internationalized domain names). Only accented letters of the French alphabet are accepted:

When You register a .CA domain name, all variants with and without accents are automatically reserved to You by the Registry in the form of a "bundle":

- Domain names reserved as a "bundle" can only be activated by the owner at the Registrar of the registered domain name.
- If You want activate one or several reserved domain names, You will have to make a classic registration request for the domain name(s) concerned.
- If You want make a transfer, all activated domain names in the "bundle" must be transferred to Your new Registrar. One transfer request will have to be made for each domain name within a deadline of 5 days or the transfer requests will be cancelled by the Registry.
- If You want make an owner change, all activated domain names in the "bundle" will also have to be transferred to the new owner.

Other conditions

To register a .CA domain name, You must agree to the following conditions:

- the registration term is from 1 to 10 years,
- to avoid any deactivation of the domain name, the renewal must be paid and funds cleared before the Expiration date.
- provide and maintain accurate, reliable and up-to-date personal contact information, failing this the .CA Registry can delete Your domain name.
- · administrative and technical contacts must be individuals.
- some words are reserved or prohibited:

- names containing two characters followed by two hyphens are not allowed.

Section .CA.5. Storage of contact information

You accept that the .CA Registry can access Your personal contact information and display it in the public Whois database.

According to the Registry rules, by default the personal information of owners who are individuals are not disclosed in the Registry Whois public database. The registry can also provide a protection to legal persons upon request in specific cases (privacyrequests@cira.ca)

Individuals can contact <u>Our customer service department</u> to request the disclosure of their information in the Whois database.

Section .CA.7. Transfer (change of Registrar)

The process is started on Our Interface. Before requesting the transfer of the domain, please be sure that You have the domain's authorization code (supplied by Your current Registrar), and that Your domain name:

- · does not have a TransferProhibited status,
- does not expire soon (We recommend that You start the transfer request at least one month prior to its Expiration),
- · was created at least 65 days,
- the last transfer has been done since more than 60 days.

The transfer of a .CA domain name does not change the domain's Expiration date.

Section .CA.8. Ownership change

Before any owner change, the new owner must have accepted the <u>Registrant Agreement</u> according to the same procedure for a registration.

The owner change can be done through a fax-based process (Gandi form and proofs of identity).

The owner change of a .CA domain name does not change the domain's Expiration date.

Section .CA.9. Deletion process

Upon the Expiration of the domain, We suspend (Hold) the domain name for 45 days, during which time all associated technical services are deactivated. Late renewal at normal price is possible during this period.

Then, the domain name is placed in Quarantine status and can be restored, in accordance with the terms and conditions described on Our website and/or as communicated by Our customer service department. The length of the Quarantine period is 30 calendar days.

If the domain is neither renewed nor restored within these deadlines, the Registry shall place the domain on "Pending Delete" status for several days, and then delete the domain name, which will become available for registration under the "first-come first-served" basis.
